

CMA Releasing Green Sea Turtle, "Chex" Who Swallowed a Balloon Public Cautioned about the Dangers of Releasing Balloons to Marine Life

PRESS RELEASE

Clearwater, FL (May 24, 2017) – "Chex," a recently rescued juvenile green sea turtle, was found floating off Redington Pier and struggling to dive. Soon after he was brought to Clearwater Marine Aquarium for rehabilitation, it was discovered that he had ingested a balloon with string attached. The entire balloon eventually passed through his gastrointestinal tract, at CMA.

Clearwater Marine Aquarium has been providing care for Chex the green sea turtle, an endangered species, since his rescue on March 20, 2017.

After two months of rehabilitation, Chex has been cleared by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and Clearwater Marine Aquarium to be released back into the wild.

Clearwater Marine Aquarium reminds individuals the dangers that balloons and plastics pose to marine life. Marine animals can become entangled or accidentally ingest these items while feeding. Once ingested, the plastic items can cause a variety of issues. Digestive tracts can become blocked, which can lead to starvation and death.

"Remember that even when far from the sea, balloons and other plastic trash may end up harming marine life and affecting entire food chains that come back to impact our own lives," says Clearwater Marine Aquarium.
