

13-year-old quadruple amputee to reunite with Winter the Dolphin

Ellie Challis aims to compete in 2020 Paralympics, inspired to swim by Winter

Clearwater, FL (May 30, 2017) – Thirteen-year-old Ellie Challis, a quadruple amputee, will visit Clearwater Marine Aquarium to see Winter the Dolphin, her inspiration. Ellie's arms and legs were amputated when she was a baby due to an illness.

Two years ago Ellie's dream came true when she flew from her home in England to meet Winter. After her visit, Ellie was inspired to become a strong swimmer despite her disability. She can now swim over a half mile and has been placed on the English para swim team. Ellie is aiming to compete at the 2020 Paralympics in Tokyo.

Ellie will reunite with Winter on Wednesday, May 31, 2017 at Clearwater Marine Aquarium. Media accommodations to be made upon request.
