Endangered Loggerhead Sea Turtle to be Released after Intense Rehab at Clearwater Marine Aquarium

'Waffle Crisp' will crawl to ocean at Honeymoon Island State Park

Clearwater, FL (Aug. 21, 2017) - Waffle Crisp, an endangered sub-adult loggerhead sea turtle, will crawl back to the ocean on Tuesday, Aug. 22, at Honeymoon Island State Park. The turtle is ready for release after extensive rehabilitation at Clearwater Marine Aquarium (CMA), including extraction of air from her body cavity and intravenous feeding.

On May 26, 2017, Waffle Crisp was found floating offshore in Citrus County, Florida. The turtle was covered in barnacles, algae, and was emaciated. She was brought to CMA where the team carefully removed the barnacles and provided her with vitamins, antibiotics and Total Parenteral Nutrition (TPN). TPN is a feeding method, commonly used on people, that inserts vital fluids through the vein to provide nutrients the body needs.

They also carefully removed air from the turtle's coelomic cavity, which is the main body cavity containing the digestive tract and other organs. Air can become trapped in this cavity for a variety reasons, like internal injuries and leakages. After three months of rehabilitation, Waffle Crisp is ready to go home.

"The level of care our turtle rehabilitation team provides for these animals is incredible," says David Yates, CEO of Clearwater Marine Aquarium. "The support from our donors and guests is essential in maintaining the advanced equipment needed to save turtles like Waffle Crisp."

Waffle Crisp will crawl home at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, Aug. 22 at Honeymoon Island State Park's North Beach: North Beach, 1 Causeway Blvd, Dunedin, FL 34698.
