

26 'Cold Snapped' Sea Turtles to be Released by Clearwater Marine Aquarium CMA Rescues and Rehabs Sea Turtles Impacted by Cold Weather

Clearwater, FL (Jan., 24, 2018) – Clearwater Marine Aquarium (CMA) will release 26 sea turtles impacted by cold water temperatures in the Gulf of Mexico. The release will be held at Honeymoon Island's North Beach on Thurs., Jan. 25 at 11 a.m. Media invited to attend.

Since Jan. 3, CMA has rescued 70 sea turtles from Pinellas and the surrounding counties that have been impacted by the frigid water temperatures. Sea turtles are cold-blooded and their internal body temperature is reliant on their external surrounding. As the water temperature drops, the turtle's body temperature drops too. When sea turtles are exposed to frigid water temperatures over several days, their circulatory systems slow down and the turtles become lethargic; floating in the water or washing ashore, unable to swim or function properly.

"The sea turtle rehabilitation team has worked hard to get these sea turtles back home as soon as possible," says David Yates, CEO. "Our team will continue to treat the remaining rescued sea turtles impacted by the cold weather with the goal of releasing them back to the wild."

The 26 rescued sea turtles have been cleared for release by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission (FWC). CMA and the FWC approved the water temperatures as acceptable for the sea turtle release this Thursday.
