Local Elementary Schools Compete in Trash to Toys Competition for Earth Day

Clearwater Marine Aquarium promotes conservation in annual competition

Clearwater, FL (April. 22, 2017) – Today is Earth Day, April 22, and Clearwater Marine Aquarium (CMA) is celebrating by announcing the winners of its annual Trash to Toys competition. 35 competing classrooms at Hillsborough and Pinellas County elementary schools designed environmental enrichment devices for the rescued dolphins at CMA using only recyclable and reused items from the classroom or the students' homes. Winter and Hope, the rescued dolphins at CMA, helped choose the finalists by each selecting their favorite toy, and rescued dolphin Nicholas chose the winner.

"This competition is an important way for young students to learn about conservation in a fun and hands on way," says Kristen Ingvertsen, Supervisor of Education Programs at Clearwater Marine Aquarium. "The goal of this contest, while definitely having fun, is to boost awareness of the importance of recycling, and reducing plastics that could end up in our oceans."

Nicholas the rescued dolphin chose the toy from Jamerson Elementary school as this year's winner. Honorable mentions went to McMullen-Booth Elementary, Mitchell Elementary, Fishhawk Creek Elementary, and Lowry Elementary. The winning classroom at Jamerson Elementary will also receive an in-class presentation from a Clearwater Marine Aquarium team member.
