

NOVA Southeastern University Partners with Clearwater Marine Aquarium on New Shark Exhibit

Nova Southeastern University is partnering with Clearwater Marine Aquarium (CMA) to bring an improved guest experience to CMA's Nurse Shark Viewing area. The newly designed area features educational facts to engage guests and provide them with an opportunity to learn more about sharks – the university's mascot.

"We're proud to partner with Nova Southeastern University," said David Yates, CEO of the Clearwater Marine Aquarium. "Their dedication to the community is as strong as their passion for offering world-class educational programs, symbolized by their mascot, the Shark."

The underwater Nurse Shark Viewing area, presented by NSU Florida, allows guests to view CMA's resident nurse sharks, Thelma and Louise, up close. Thelma and Louise came to CMA through a private collector who no longer had the space to accommodate the sharks' size. Because they were domesticated, Thelma and Louise lack essential survival skills and could not be released into the wild. The veterinary staff at CMA trains both sharks using target poles.
